with all your people.


In a special way, we keep in mind the children, women and men


Principals Study Tour to Canada



Yesterday we began the Season of Lent by celebrating Ash Wednesday Mass. On Ash Wednesday, Christians are signed with an ashen cross as a reminder of their call to become more like Jesus and as an acknowledgement that at times they don't live up to their Christian call.

Do you know where the ashes come from?

The ashes used on Ash Wednesday are made by burning the palms that were blessed at the previous year's Palm Sunday Mass. On Palm Sunday people welcomed Jesus as their King and vowed to follow him but in only a week they turned their back on him and shouted to have him crucified. The ashes remind us that though we profess to follow Jesus, often our words and actions let us down. The 6 weeks of Lent calls us to reflect on our lives and to take up words and actions that make us more like Jesus.



Project Compassion

During Lent Catholic schools and churches support the aid agency Caritas and their Project Compassion appeal which brings thousands of Australians together in solidarity with the world's poor to help end poverty, promote justice and uphold dignity. Every child will bring home a Project Compassion box. During this time, we encourage one another to go without luxury items and treats and to donate the money to our Project Compassion boxes so as to improve the lives of those living in extreme poverty. In their individual classes children will be learning about the work of Caritas and how the coins they donate to their small box can change lives in a big way. Children with Medical Requirements / Medic Alerts

St Munchin's requires a medical form to be completed for **all children** who need to take any form of medication or have a medical condition of which the school staff needs to be made aware. If you have kept medication in the office from last year, please call in to check the expiry date. It is important that if your child requires medication, that this medication is handed into the class teacher or the office.



Parent Contact Details

The school needs to successfully communicate with families, especially at short notice and it is important that family contact details are kept up to date. On many occasions, we encounter difficulties in trying to contact parents or guardians by telephone. Home and mobile numbers are often out of service, mobiles switched off, or message bank facilities lacking. Occasionally work situations have changed making day time contact by phone or email difficult.
